3yo Update

We continue to support our developing three year old groups in their ability to separate from their parents and increase their confidence in the kinder environment. This term we are focusing on the children getting to know their peers and to learn their names. Our intentional teaching for the term is for the children to begin to develop their name recognition. We will also be learning about shapes and introducing and developing cutting skills.

Last term the children showed an interest in dinosaurs so we are incorporating imaginative dinosaur floor play and explorative dinosaur ice eggs in the sensory trays.

The children are very settled and we have extended their focus at mat time by introducing the game 'doggie doggie'.

4yo Update

The children have returned to preschool this term settled and ready to go!

Our natural world plays an important part in the childrens' learning and inspires curiosity, exploration and joy. Our yard provides both native and deciduous trees. As a result we can experience the wonder of change as leaves fall, flowers bloom and fruit grows. The changes Autumn brings are a large part of the programmes at the moment. We are celebrating Nature Week with a particular focus on natural materials – the children are manipulating clay, collecting materials from outside for their crafts and play, and will be walking to Sorrento Park during the term.

Mums - how wonderful and special they are and how much we love them were a focus in the lead up to Mothers Day.

The groups each held a pampering session for their Mums (or somebody else special) last week.

The Green group children are working on a "Feelings" book and discussing what makes them happy, sad, angry, silly and expressing this with drawing and stories.

Red group are interested in colours, dances, feathers, birds and flight.

The Blue group children are interested in dinosaurs and making elaborate robot box constructions. With lots of babies on the way they are also learning about mothers and babies and lullabies.

Your child's safety around roads



Supervise your children on or near roads

It will take many years for young children to develop the skills and knowledge they need to be on their own in the traffic environment and to keep themselves safe. Parents and carers can help children by providing plenty of practical supervised experience in using the road safely, as a part of the journeys taken every day. Research shows that children under age 12 do not have the skills and experience to be safe in traffic. Teach them safe traffic behaviour and set a good example. Children up to about 10 years of age are at particular risk of pedestrian injury. This is because they are small in size, and are still learning to detect the presence of traffic and to judge the speed and distance of traffic. So make sure that young children are closely supervised by an adult when in the road environment.

Walk with your children

Children, assisted by adults, need regular practice in the real road environment. Walking with children to and from school, around the block or to the local shops can help develop children's skills in the road environment. As you walk together, ask children simple questions that encourage thinking and reflection, for example:

- * Where is the safest place to cross this road?
- * What do we need to do before we cross the road together?
- * Why do we hold hands to cross the road together?
- * When is it safe to cross the road?
- * What do we look for when crossing the road?
- * What sounds are we listening for when crossing the road?

Driveway safety

When you are walking with children it is important to demonstrate that children should approach driveways with caution. Engage children in conversations to help improve their safety when walking near driveways. For example, ask: how they can tell if a vehicle is coming out of the driveway? (e.g. listen for sounds, look for clues such as exhaust emissions, reversing lights or beeps from trucks). Help your child get in and out of the vehicle safely. Make it a habit of getting your children in and out of the car from the passenger side (kerbside).
